Thank you to the St. Teresa of Calcutta team of teachers. This is the reason we have such an exciting and vibrant school where our students continue to excel. You truly make a difference!



\*Just a reminder that if you are interested in volunteering within the school in any capacity, including field trips, student support, Catholic School Council member, etc., a valid Criminal Reference Check (CRC), with Vulnerable Sector Check - Level 3 is required. Please contact the office if you need help with the application process.

### School Visitors

All visitors must report to the office. School personnel will assist with the entry of late students as well as the early release of students for appointments. All students leaving the school during the school day will only be released through the front office and we ask that parents please wait at the front door to receive their child safely.

### Sign In/Out Book

Normally before leaving school early during the day, children must be signed out from the school office by a parent/guardian. If your child needs to leave school during the school day, you must notify the classroom teacher or the office in writing/via email/by phone. Once you arrive, please ring the doorbell and we will arrange to have your child brought to you at the front door.

### DID YOU KNOW?

Showing up on time every day is important to your child's success and learning from preschool forward.

Missing 10% of school (1-2 days every few weeks) can:

- Make it harder to develop early reading skills
- Make it harder to develop numeracy skills
- Develop a poor attendance pattern that's hard to break
- Absences can affect the whole class as time may be required to help children catch up
- Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school and themselves

## Fire Drills/Lock Down Procedures

We are required to conduct three fire drills in the fall and three in the spring. We are also required to practice two lock down drills during the year and one Shelter in Place. Lock down drills involve students moving away from the classroom door to a location within the classroom away from windows. Lights are turned off and the doors are locked. These practices are to ensure that students and staff are prepared in case we should need to go into lock down. Lock down / Hold and Secure procedures would be initiated by police and Board security personnel.

### Indoor/Outdoor Shoes

Students are asked to ensure that they have a pair of indoor shoes at school. As the weather gets wetter, we ask that children change their footwear when they come inside to keep our classroom floors clean.



Sometimes parents take the opportunity to bring their pets with them to school when dropping off or picking up students. We would like to remind parents, for safety reasons, if you have brought a pet with you when meeting or dropping off your child, we ask that you please wait off school property, as dogs are not permitted on the school grounds. There has been some discussion about the number of dogs on school property in the evenings. Please call 311 to report your concerns.

Just a friendly reminder STOC community: Skateboards, bicycles and scooters are not allowed on the property during school hours. For everyone's safety, please walk your skateboards, bikes, and scooter while on school property.

### PERSONAL ELECTRONIC DEVICES (PEDS) ON BOARD PREMISES

The Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board acknowledges the value of the use of technology for learning. Students are permitted to register and use personal electronic devices (PEDs) on board premises and/or board sanctioned events for educational purposes, under the direction of staff and only with parent/guardian permission (GF 066- Network User Application and Agreement, completed at initial registration). Students may register their PED for the purpose of connecting to the board wireless network. Students are required to adhere to the student "Personal Electronic Device Used with WI-FI Network Student Agreement" and the "Network User Application and Agreement." The student agreement GF 337 will need to be signed before students can use the WiFi network. The forms were sent home with verification packages. Please be advised that the Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board will not be responsible for any cost incurred through the use of personal data plans.

PEDs are to be used responsibly and should not interfere with learning; their use must comply with the Catholic Code of Conduct, board policies and procedures. Any personal communications (i.e., phone calls, text messages, etc.) will continue to be directed through the main office. Failure to comply with these guidelines may result in a loss of PED privileges and/or any other consequences deemed necessary by school administration.

The school principal may authorize limited acceptable uses of personal electronic devices during school-sanctioned activities for a specific designated purpose outside of instructional spaces and/or in common areas.

Students are responsible for the safety and security of PEDs at all times and the Board assumes no responsibility for lost, damaged or stolen devices.

**PLEASE** *do not* call/text your child during school hours. Parents/Guardians are asked to call the school office & students are directed to use the school office phone when they need to communicate with families at home.

### Student Insurance

Insure My Kids information brochure was sent home in September. Enrolment is voluntary.

#### Medication

On occasion, the school is asked to store and/or give medication to students. Medication of any kind cannot be stored on school property without the proper medical forms on file.

- A completed form must accompany each request for medication to be stored by the school
- School personnel will not assume responsibility for the administration of any medication.
- It is the responsibility of the parent/guardian to monitor the quantity of medication stored by the school.
- 4. Please let the office know if you require Storage of Medication Forms so they can be forwarded to you.

#### Reminder

For your child's safety we request that he/she not be on school property until supervision begins at 8:40 a.m. Please do not drop your child off at the school prior to 8:40 a.m.

### **Halloween Costumes Considerations**

To create safe, caring and inclusive spaces within our schools, please consider the impact costume choices may have on others. Families are encouraged to select costumes that may not be considered offensive to someone's religion, culture, race, gender, gender expression, ability, heritage, or sexual orientation.

Everyone has the freedom to express themselves within reasonable limits. As a caring Catholic community, we must ensure that the costume choices are not offensive to, or mocking of, others.

Rather than creating a list of inappropriate costumes, we encourage families discuss with students what is appropriate, what is not appropriate, and why. Below are some guidelines to consider before choosing a costume. These questions will help determine what constitutes an offensive/disrespectful costume, and applies to "characters" from media, including TV or films. (Adapted from Simon Fraser University).

### Does your costume:

- Mock or condescend oppressed people and/or cultures?
- Include face painting for the sole purpose of matching the skin colour of a specific person or people?
- Mock or condescend religions or religious beliefs?
- Use sacred objects/clothing of others' religions/ cultures?
- Caricaturize marginalized groups or persons (historical or current) in a way that may serve to trivialize them?


